School's out, schedules are different, people are traveling, but our ministries continue in full gear at Midwest City Free Methodist Church. In addition to our Sunday and Wednesday activities here, we are planning lots of special activities for family fun, for outreach with the Gospel, and to serve the community. Throughout this newsletter you will see lots of them listed—make note of dates you don't want to miss!

The first two Sundays of June will find different faces in the pulpit, with Teen Sunday on the 1st and Rev. Jim Gillis bringing the message on Pentecost Sunday, June 8th. On June 15th, we will finish the series on the

appearances of Jesus "After Resurrection," looking at Jesus' dramatic intervention in the life of Saul, later known as the Apostle Paul. On June 22nd, I will begin a new sermon series from Paul's Letter to the Philippians, on "Keeping Healthy." This 2000-year-old letter to Christians in a Greek city, from their founding pastor while under house arrest, is amazingly relevant to a church in Oklahoma in the 21st Century!

The Building Committee and Board of Trustees are spending many hours seeking God's will for the next steps in our building renovation program "For the Next Generation," and for the care of our present facilities and equipment. One recent estimate suggests we need as much as \$35,000 in new heating and air conditioning equipment immediately, to replace what has deteriorated or failed completely. We are working with knowledgeable people to find the best ways of solving the problems, with the very best stewardship, and in ways that match our renovation plans. All of this highlights the need for prayer and continued faithful giving, so that our facilities can be at their best.

During the summer lots of people move to a different address. Don't forget to keep us updated with your contact information, so you don't miss anything happening here. And . . . even more important: keep your eyes open for new families moving into your neighborhood, give them a friendly welcome, and invite them to find new friends through our church and its ministries.

The Building Committee and Board of trustees are spending many hours seeking god's will for the next steps in our building program, "For the Next Generation," and for the care of our present facilities and equipment. The failure of some of our air conditioning units has taken a toll on everyone's comfort! After meeting with many different companies, we were able to find a firm willing to repair some equipment we had originally been told could only be addressed with total replacement for tens of thousands of dollars. This will allow us proceed with plans for upgrade of our overall systems within the context of the renovation and repurposing, instead of under pressure. All this highlights the need for prayer and faithful giving, so that our facilities can be at their best.
