LENT has been celebrated in churches around the world for many centuries, in the six weeks leading up to Easter Sunday. During this time we focus on why Jesus died, and why we need the forgiveness and new birth bought through his giving his life for us. It is a time for examining ourselves to discover anything standing in the way of our close relationship with Christ, and finding freedom through repentance and faith. Many people celebrate Lent by giving up some sort of food, entertainment, or other practice in order to focus more energy on prayer and spiritual growth. This is helpful, but what is even more helpful is to ask God to show us *permanent* changes we need in our lives! Lent begins on February 10th with our **Ash Wednesday Service.**



The entire church community will meet for an Ash Wednesday service on February 10 at 7PM. Ash Wednesday is

the beginning of the Lenten Season. During the service the sign of the cross will be placed on either the forehead or the right hand of each person. The ashes are from the burnt palm leaves of the previous year's Palm Sunday and reserved for this sacred time. Hymns, prayers, Scripture readings and the Lord's Supper will all be part of the service.

LENTEN PRAYER TIMES

In connection with Lent, we are also beginning a new prayer emphasis.

The church will be open for prayer, with at least one staff member present, three times a week, at hours chosen so everyone can participate in one of the

sessions: 7:00AM on Tuesday, Noon on Wednesday, and 6:00PM on Thursday. This will begin February 11th, with prayer times at all three hours that day, and then on the designated days until Easter. These will not be "services" but simply a time to pray! Come join us!


CANDLELIGHT MEMORIAL SERVICE
